
ROME, Dec. 10-The Vatican emphasized today the "ecumenical significance" of Pope Paul's pilgrimage to the Holy Land next month.

It voiced the hope that the journey to Jordan and Israel would contribute to unity, enabling all Christians to pray and worship "around the same altar." The comment was broadcast by the Vatican radio in various languages.

Meanwhile, Pope Paul VI was reported to have sent a message to Athenagoras I, Ecumenical Patriarch of the Eastern Orthodox Church, accepting his proposal for a meeting in Jerusalem on Epihany, Jan. 6.
